Specific offence guidance dictates robust response particularly breaches of bail. Current model is event based as opposed to person centric. Changes within COPFS to a centralised marking system may also have impact upon previous positive working relationships at local level.

Discussion highlighted variance across authorities in both level of supports as well as in uptake of support services. Point raised as to possibility of solutions to breach of bail by yp in using diversion to address rather than take before the Court. The Scot Govt Court Support Guidance will be updated and developments in information/ actions from this group can contribute to that working group.
