The Whole System Approach: responding to complexity and lessons learned

Discussing the Whole System Approach: what it is, the rationale behind this, how it has attempted to respond to the complexity of the lives of children involved in offending, and what has been achieved. It will particularly explore what Community Justice can learn from the Whole System Approach, and will consider the potential for extending the Whole System Approach to adults.

Working with Young People: Core Skills for Practice

Examining the core skills needed for establishing effective working relationships with challenging young people and for effective youth justice practice.

Managing High Risk

Considering the theories behind working with the small but significant cohort of young people who present with high risk behaviours including violence or harmful sexual behaviour, and subsequent methods of managing risk, which can include learnings from the Interventions for Vulnerable Youth (IVY) Project. A half-day awareness raising session on Care and Risk Management is also available as part of this roadshow theme.

Reintegration and Transitions

Exploring good practice and responsibilities in working with young people in transitions, including between the Children's Hearings System and Criminal Justice System, and who are reintegrating to their community from custody and secure care.

Restorative Justice (RJ)

RJ aims to bring together persons both harmed and responsible to address the impact of offending behaviour. This session will consider the merits of RJ in the context of early and effective intervention and cases of high risk offences.

Early and Effective Intervention (EEI)

Assisting with understanding and implementation of the Framework of Core Elements to promote minimum standards for EEI practice and the implementation of the Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014.

Measuring Outcomes

This roadshow, based on the outcome model of GIRFEC and the SHANARRI wellbeing domains, aims to develop professional understanding and confidence in differentiating between inputs, outputs and outcomes, and measuring outcomes.

“Getting It Right for Girls”- Working with Vulnerable and High Risk Girls

Exploring the needs of vulnerable and high risk girls and examining the theories of relational aggression and resilience. Requirements for effective practice and good practice examples in working with girls will also be shared.

Bereavement, Loss and Trauma

Looking at the impact that a wide range of losses, as well as bereavement and trauma, can have on young people’s behaviour. Hear about the latest research and reflect on the implications for practice.

Working with Young People in the Criminal Justice System

With a focus on legislation and policy areas relevant to young people who offend, this session was designed specifically for criminal justice staff who are working with young people under 18.

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
