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advised a meeting between PSPs and police is taking place on 7/11; Police Scotland approach to young people now published - action plan is an area of work where we may be able to influence; with a range of issues such as flexibility, rethinking what is deemed policing in the face of pressures, managerial support, and the importance of relationship-building for yp's long-term outcomes highlighted;

-Yp not having anywhere to go or things to do and the importance of addressing this in giving a sense of purpose, filling time, having people who care and this being a place and space for change. In terms of service design, the importance of available, responsive and sustainable accessible. services, that adopt an assertive outreach approach, highlighted. The community role of development and youthwork was cited in this, although financial pressures have often lead to the loss of these services, and also the importance of activities that are not 'service-based'. Corporate parenting duties may be a lever to access services, as may the Community Empowerment Act and position in CPPs. It was however noted Leisure Trusts are independent position from local authorities in some areas which may adversely affect this:

- -Issues with employment (being addressed via Opportunities for All subgroup);
- -Challenges of supporting young people to be ready to engage with services/interventions and then moving young people beyond services to social networks, opportunities etc but recognise that achieving a "positive destination" is often not the end of these yp support needs and this is a longer journey. SACRO are currently exploring mentoring, advocacy and counselling services in schools, which they will seek feedback from Group on;
- -That yp leaving custody have different throughcare needs to adults and gender needs differ-the importance of early intervention, an individualised approach, and often longer support was highlighted;
- -Rethinking how we frame desistance-ceasing offending is only one part and other outcomes (such as quality of life) are key both in sustaining desistance and improving outcomes;
- -Need to ensure basic needs such as housing and benefits (including sanction issues) are met.

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4.2 School inclusion

- -Common themes paper shared-this remains draft and any feedback to be shared with GR ASAP. This will be the basis for GR's input to attainment advisors event.
- -Further information on attainment fund is available.
- -Ellen Birt updated on Empowering Teachers, Parents and Communities to Achieve Excellence and Equity in Education – A Governance Review. Ellen provided an overview of the context and specifically asked the ILC Group for:
 - Suggestions of how organisations, young people and parents can be engaged in a meaningful way;
 - Initial views on the consultation document.

Initial views were shared at the meeting and anyone with suggestions re: engagement should contact Ellen. Information is also available to support agencies to engage with yp. It was agreed GR, AM and DN will develop an initial response from the Group which will be circulated and individual organisations are also encouraged to respond.

4.3 Health and wellbeing

- -Common themes document to be shared with group for comments and suggested use. Key issues are mental and emotional wellbeing; accessing local services when young people are leaving secure care or custody; and what kind of local, community-based formal and informal services can our yp access and where available, what are the barriers to accessing services? LM will consider further how this can be utilised and next steps may include how services can be supported to implement this in practice;
- -LM updated NHS Ayrshire and Arran are undertaking significant work on Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder. In the pilot, 40% of LAC would fit diagnosis. While understanding of the impact of such an in utero brain injury on capacity, development and cognitive ability is growing, as is recognition that traditional ways of working may not be appropriate, the issue is what to do next for these yp. As a first step, inputs to schools are being provided.
- -Feedback collated on specialist school nursing review which GR will share with Julia Egan (SG).
