#### The standards

- Aim to:
- -Improve the experiences and seek to provide better outcomes for young people; through a coherent set of expectations and standards across the continuum of intensive supports;
- -Ensure that children and young people are treated with respect and dignity, and that the human and children's rights they are all entitled to are upheld;
- -Compliment the National Health and Social Care Standards and the legal requirements, ethos and principles set out in all the relevant existing statutory and practice guidance;
- -Set out what young people and their families should expect from professionals and Corporate Parents when a young person is being intensively supported in the community or in a secure care setting, following the journey



#### **Secure Care Group**

- Established in February 2019
- To provide strategic oversight to ensure that the remaining tasks of the board are completed and avoid overlap with ICR
- Co-chaired by COSLA and Scottish Government
- Currently developing a project plan for the finalisation, design, delivery and implementation of the standards



#### CYCJ role

- Supporting design, delivery and implementation of the Standards
- Support improvements and transformational change
- Continue links with, learning from and integration of the developing STARR model
- Meaningful and visible progression of the Mental Health Strategy
- To build on the research, evidence and data analysis
