







Children involved in a pattern of offending, or who are involved in more serious offences, are almost always our most vulnerable, victimised and traumatised young people

- * Brain development and maturity
- * About 60% have Speech, Language and Communication Needs
- * Higher prevalence of mental health issues than the general population
- * Brain injury, FASD, and learning disability
- * School exclusion
- Needs have often gone unrecognised and/or undiagnosed



Vulnerability, adversity and Victimisation

Experienced victimisation and adult harassment	Peers involved in offending/bullying	
Take risky health behaviours	Self-harm/ para-suicidal Behaviour	
Be socially deprivation	Family turbulence	
Weak bonds	Personality Measures	



The impact of system involvement

- Contact with the youth justice system is the biggest factor in whether someone will continue to offend
- The impact of labelling, stigma and the "usual suspects"
- The importance of not intervening as a 'justice' service and keeping children out of formal systems (McAra and McVie, 2010)
